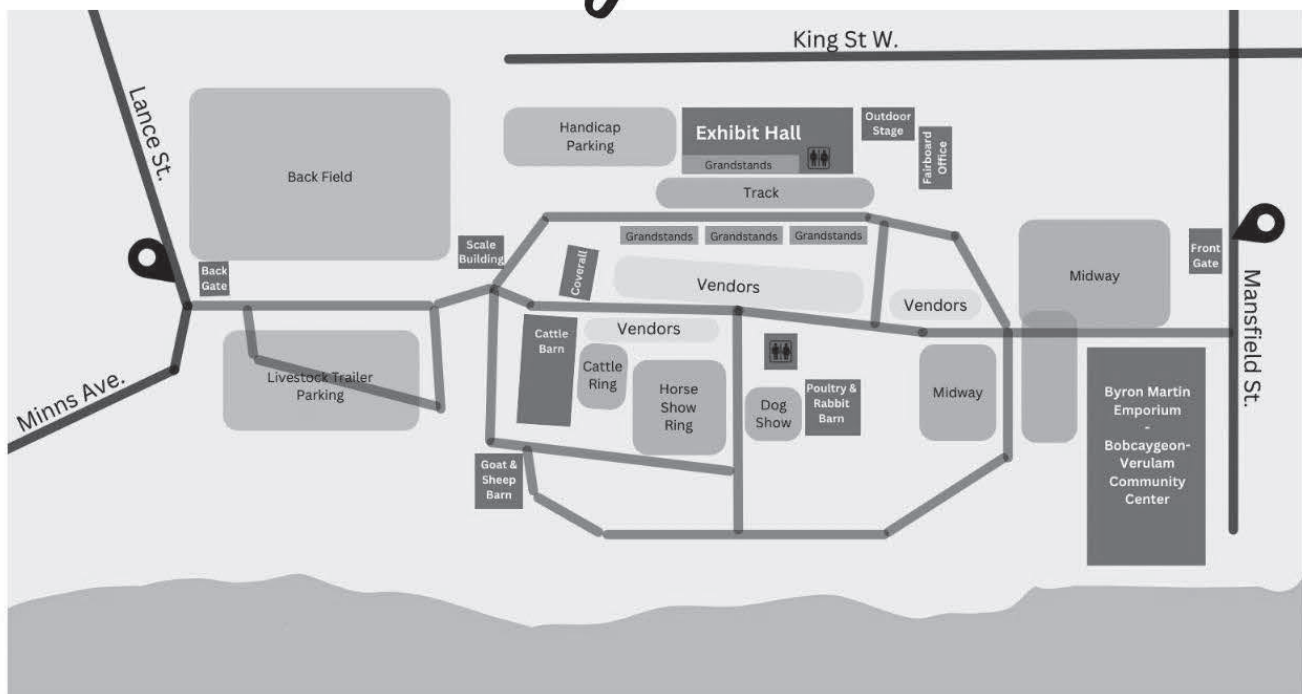

General Rules & Regulations

1. No membership fees will be charged.
2. In all articles of manufacture, grain, seed, and produce, no person shall enter in the same section, more than one article of each kind and not more than two entries in all other sections, livestock included. This rule must be strictly adhered to.
3. All animals and articles must be the bonafide property of the exhibitors, and all grain and vegetables to be the growths of the current year except clover and flax seed, which may be the growth of the previous year.
4. The judge shall have the power to decide whether the animal or article is worthy of a prize or not, and when there is little or no competitions they are to decide what prize they are entitled to, if any.
5. No person is allowed to interfere with the Judges during the Fair.
6. The General Manager will receive entry lists, either by person, AssistExpo, mail, or email, until 8 pm on the Wednesday of fair week unless a closing date is otherwise stated. No entry tickets will be mailed unless mailing arrangements are made with the Secretary.
7. No percentage deducted.
8. All exhibits, (except horses, cattle, sheep, and poultry) must be placed for judging at the Exhibition Hall before 12:00 noon Thursday October 1st, 2026, or they will not be accepted. This rule will be strictly adhered to.
9. If any dispute occurs, General Manager shall hold premiums until settled.
10. Exhibitors of purebred animals shall produce pedigrees to the satisfaction of the judge or they will not be entitled to a prize.
11. Persons violating any of the rules to be subject to expulsion from the Society and forfeit all prizes they may be entitled to.
12. **RHID TAGS & INSURANCE:** All livestock must have RHID tags on the animals (except goats). If they are not tagged they will not be allowed to be removed from the exhibitors trailer. All animal/livestock exhibitors must provide proof of farm, home or business insurance showing 2 million public liability coverage. Copy to be provided upon registration.
13. All animals to have halters. Young calves to be judged according to age. Age to be on ticket.
14. All or any protests must be made on the day of the Fair, and each protest must be accompanied by the sum of \$5.00, which will be refunded if the protest is sustained.
15. No exhibitor can remove any animal after being placed at the Fair without depositing \$5.00 with General Manager. This deposit will be refunded when the animal is returned as agreed upon.
16. The Directors reserve the right to interpret the rules and regulations of the Prize List.
17. During the days of the Fair, no refreshment stands, shows, exhibits, hucksters, or any kind of performance will be allowed within 300 yards of the Fair Grounds, except by consent of the Concession Committee, which is according to Statute.
18. No animal shall compete for more than one prize. Cattle in herd, Sheep in pen classes, Harness Horses and Specials excepted. That no sire shall be shown in more than one herd.
19. Each exhibitor must supply the admin staff with a list of their entries giving the correct class and section number.
20. All specials open except where specified.
21. Entry tickets will be lifted by the Directors as each class is shown.
22. Where an award is made for points: In case of a tie the exhibitor having the most prizes will be declared the winner.
23. All prize money and merchandise must be cashed before end of year. Cheques will not be accepted after the end of the year.
24. The admin staff will be in the office at the Fairgrounds, Tuesday from 9:00 am until 5:00 pm, Wednesday from 9:00 am until 7:00 pm and Thursday 8:30 am until 12 noon for the purpose of receiving entry forms.
25. Exhibit Hall will close Saturday at 4:30 pm and re-open at 5:30 pm. No exhibits to be removed from Hall (Curling Club) until 5:30 pm Saturday
26. All exhibits shown at owners risk against loss or damage.

DEFINITIONS

- **Entry Form:** List of items you wish to enter in competition showing class and section.
- **Entry Ticket:** Ticket obtained from the Fair Office showing Exhibitor Number. Ticket must be attached to exhibit entered. (Livestock excepted).
- **Exhibit:** Item entered for competition.

Privacy Policy

Any information collected by the Bobcaygeon Agricultural Society regarding members, exhibitors, commercial exhibitors, sponsors, directors and any other persons related directly to the business of the Bobcaygeon Agricultural Society, and the Bobcaygeon Fall Fair, will be solely used for the purposes of promotion of the Bobcaygeon Agricultural Society and the Bobcaygeon Fair, for processing payment of prize monies and other payments owed: for publication of the winner's names in local papers: and for the maintenance of their files and data base. Any member, exhibitor, commercial exhibitor, sponsor or director realizes that when they agree to take part in the Bobcaygeon Agricultural Society and the Bobcaygeon Fair that their names may be published for these reasons only. None of this information whatsoever will be sold or transferred to any outside party for any reason.

This will ensure your entry tickets will be prepared and waiting for you to pick them up in the Fair Office all day Tuesday and Wednesday and Thursday Morning.

It is also strongly encouraged that Junior and Mini preregister by that day so they may attend the preliminary event on September 19th, where the Senior Ambassador will be determined. ***Registrations for Junior and Mini will be accepted until noon September 28th***

Senior Ambassador

The reigning Senior Ambassador will be have the opportunity to:

- Represent their community

- Celebrate Agriculture and their community

***** New This Year ****** The competition for Senior Ambassador will take place 2 weeks prior to the fair, on Saturday, September 19th. We invite all ages of ambassadors to spectate.

- The program is open to anyone that will be 17 years of age on or before the second Monday in August and not have reached their 24th birthday by Labour Day. Participants must be at least 18 years of age by August 18th, 2025 to participate in the CNE Ambassador of the Fairs Competition which they may only participate in one time.
- Participants must be a resident of Canada for two years and a resident of their Fair District for six months.
- Participants must be able to attend to all Ambassador duties during the Bobcaygeon Fall Fair and for the 12 month period following, which includes various setup assistance, helping with Agricultural Education day and assistance at events during the fair including but not limited to: Demolition Derby, Truck & Tractor Pull & Parade, ribbon & trophy presentations at livestock shows and other events.
- Prior to the competition commencing, participants should disclose any known scheduling conflicts (ie: work, school, travel plans).
- Participants appear in appropriate attire.
- The competition will include a private interview with judges, a short prepared speech (approximately 3-5 minutes) and a period of Question & Answer before an audience (list of questions will be provided prior to the competition).
- The competition will be judged on the basis of:
 - Composure
 - Character
 - Public speaking ability
 - General knowledge of the community and fair
 - General knowledge of agriculture and current affairs
- In the event that the Ambassador cannot complete their duties, the 1st runner up will assist.
- The Ambassador is expected to attend various events on the Saturday of the fair (ie: parade, ribbon & trophy presentations at livestock show and other events, etc.)
- The Ambassador is expected to attend to their duties in appropriate attire.
- The Ambassador of the Fair will be asked to represent the Bobcaygeon Fall Fair at various functions throughout the year, including some of but not limited to the following:

- The program is open to those that are between the age of 12 - 16 years of age by the Bobcaygeon Fall Fair.
- Participants must be a resident of Canada for two years and a resident of their District (4) for six months.
- Participants must be able to help with Ambassador duties during the Friday night and Saturday of the Bobcaygeon Fall Fair and for some events during the 12 month period following.
- Participants should appear in appropriate attire.
- Participants will have the opportunity to familiarize themselves with the stage experience on the Wednesday evening prior to the event.
- The participant will be interviewed by a panel and asked how they are involved in the community and deliver a short prepared speech (1-2 minutes) on "What their favourite Fair memory is".
